Join lecture hosts Dar Williams and Michael Robinson for an entertaining and educational look at how the Revolutionary War played out in our area. Dr. Johnson, an avid Revolutionary War re-enactor, will lecture in period attire, and discuss the encampments at West Point and Constitution Island; the North and South Redoubts in Garrison; and the [Fishkill Supply Depot and Encampment](#), located under the mostly-abandoned Dutchess Mall on Route 9, just north of Cold Spring.

A retired US Army Colonel and former PCHS trustee, Dr. Johnson is perhaps best-known as the Military Historian for the Hudson River Valley National Heritage Area and Executive Director of the Hudson River Valley Institute at Marist College.
